



Discharge information following your Cystoscopy

This procedure may have just been an examination or:

- Dilations (stretching of the bladder)
- Diathermy of the bladder
- Biopsy of tissue
- X-ray with catheter

When passing urine you may experience some discomfort such as a burning sensation, urgency, frequency and occasionally poor control. Some blood may also be present. To help minimise and relieve some of these temporary problems try to drink at least two litres of fluid a day for the next week, unless your doctor advises otherwise. Ural/Citralite from the chemist, taken as directed, may help relieve some of the discomfort.

An appointment may have been arranged for you to see your doctor. Please check prior to discharge home.

If you develop:

- Unrelieved pain
- Inability to pass urine
- Fever and / or chills
- Excessive bleeding
